Since July 2010 there are three crime reports of Theft from Millennium Green and ball court area and one report of criminal damage (swing damaged by fire)

At King George V Playing Fields between 2007 and 2010 there is one report of Theft and three of Criminal Damage. The Damage offences were damage to playing equipment, grassy mounds and the glass door of the football club. With the latter, the suspect was interviewed and admitted to breaking the window whilst intoxicated and was given a Fixed Penalty Notice.

From 2010 to date there are five intelligence reports relating to King George V Playing Fields covering drugs, anti-social behaviour, stop checks and young persons drinking alcohol there.

From 2011 to date there is one intelligence report relating to Millennium Green regarding alcohol related anti social behaviour and young persons drinking at the location (March 2012).

Incidents that have occurred but not been reported as a crime or intelligence report are as follows (recorded in PCSO Mayo PNB's and Emails from the Parish Council clerk) :-
Millennium Green area --

Empty drugs bags (some smelt of cannabis, others had remains of brown powder) found in the play area (October 2011, June, July and August 2012) by PCSO Mayo.

Offensive graffiti found on play equipment in May 2012 by PCSO Mayo.
Empty alcohol bottles and cans found littered by play equipment and basket ball court in July 2012 by PCSO Mayo.

A dog walker who lives in Gooseham Mead stated she regularly collects empty alcohol bottles and cans from the play equipment area in the early morning when spoken to in July 2012. The Parish Council village orderly also states he collects lots of alcohol related litter from the green area.

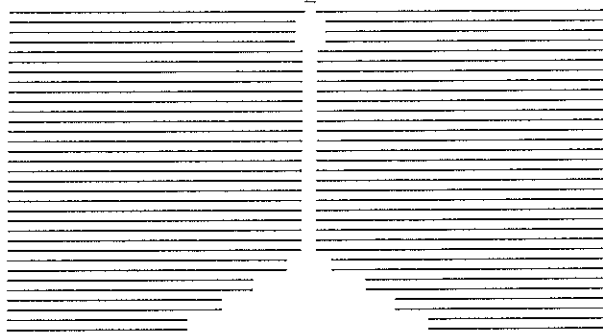
A report from the Parish Council of youths drinking and smashing bottles on the green witnessed by a resident from Gooseham Mead. May 2012.

King George V area --
The Parish Council village orderly states he regularly collects alcohol related litter from the area.

An active member of the cricket club stated that in the summer of 2011 they regularly had minor damage to the field, the covers and the sponsor signs, along with empty alcohol containers and smashed bottles.

I have one concern with the enforcement of the order in relation to the area referred to as King George V Jubilee Playing Fields. CONGRESBURY

It is noted that you are considering the implementation of the above order with regard to the area from Congresbury Bridge, including the shelter on the A370 known as Millennium Green and its whole perimeter.

As the Neighbourhood Watch Co-ordinator for Gooseham Mead which overlooks The Millennium Green, I can confirm that there are frequent incidents of anti-social behaviour, disturbance and undue noise late into the evening, and also in the early hours of the morning. There is no doubt that these incidents are often occurring due to the consumption of alcohol, and with that in mind, I fully support the earliest possible implementation of The Act, and can confirm that this opinion will be shared by the majority of those living within this NHW scheme.
