RECOMMENDATIONS

That the sub committee determines the application for the variation of the Premises Licence.

1. SUMMARY OF REPORT

- 1.1 An application has been received for the variation of the premises licence for the Imperial, 14 South Parade, Weston super Mare. The application made is to extend the current opening times and licensable activities on Thursday to Sunday until 1:30am. Consultation has been carried out and a representation has been received from a local resident regarding crime and disorder and public nuisance.

2. POLICY

- 2.1 The Council's statement of Licensing Policy applies to this application.
- 2.2 The Licensing Act 2003 requires licensing authorities to carry out their functions with a view to promoting the following four licensing objectives:
- a) The Prevention of Crime and Disorder.
 - b) Public Safety.
 - c) The Prevention of Public Nuisance, and
 - d) The Protection of Children from Harm.
- 2.3 The Licensing Authority should have regard to the Statutory Guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003, and the provisions of the Licensing Act itself.

3. DETAILS

- 3.1 An application was received on the 27th June 2018 from Mr Michael Sanders for the variation of a Premises Licence under the Licensing Act 2003, in respect of the Imperial, 14 South Parade, Weston super Mare. A copy of the application that has been made is shown at **Appendix A**.
- 3.2 The premise comprises of a three-story building with the public house operating on the first and second floors only.
- 3.3 The Imperial has commercial and residential properties within 100 metres of the licensed premises.
- 3.4 A copy of a location plan of the premises is shown at **Appendix B**.
- 3.5 The licensable activities and opening times of the premises to members of the public being sought are as follows:

6.1 The Licensing Authority recognises that its licensing function is only one means of securing the delivery of the service. - Gambling Act 2005

6.3 The Licensing Authority also has regard to any other relevant legislation, strategies, policies and guidance in its decision-making.

7. RISK MANAGEMENT

7.1 Regularly reviewing licensing policies and practices and using a risk-rated approach to both proactive and reactive enforcement reduces the risk to the Authority. Ensuring MoU agreements are in place with external partner agencies will also help strengthen roles and responsibilities surrounding Licensing work.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

Door supervisors will be engaged from 9pm, on Thursday, Friday and Saturday until the premises close; at least one door supervisor will be on duty, an additional door supervisor will be engaged on duty if the number of persons on the premises exceeds 100. A ratio of one door supervisor per 100 or part 100 will be maintained.

At all other times, door supervisors will be engaged at the discretion of the management, however door supervisor/s will also be engaged following any request from a police constable, they will be deployed in the ratio and for the time specified in the request.

c) Public safety

ALL DOOR SUPERVISORS

Will be correctly registered with the SIA. Will display the correct name badge. Will carry proof of registration, will be used in a ratio agreed with the Police and Licensing Authority. All door supervisors will wear clothing easily and clearly identifiable by CCTV.

The licensee will maintain a register kept solely for this purpose showing full name, SIA badge number, time on duty and time off duty for each door personnel, numbers on the door daily. This will be retained for a period of 12 months and be made available for inspection by the Police or Licensing Authority.

DRINKS PROMOTIONS: All-inclusive nights or excessive drinks promotions will not be employed.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

There will be no entry or re-entry to the premises after 00:30 on Friday and Saturday nights and after midnight on other weekdays. Customers will be allowed to leave the premises for the purpose of smoking, but will be "stamped" before leaving the premises so that it can be shown that they are entitled to return. Customers will not be allowed to take their drinks into the street.

e) The protection of children from harm



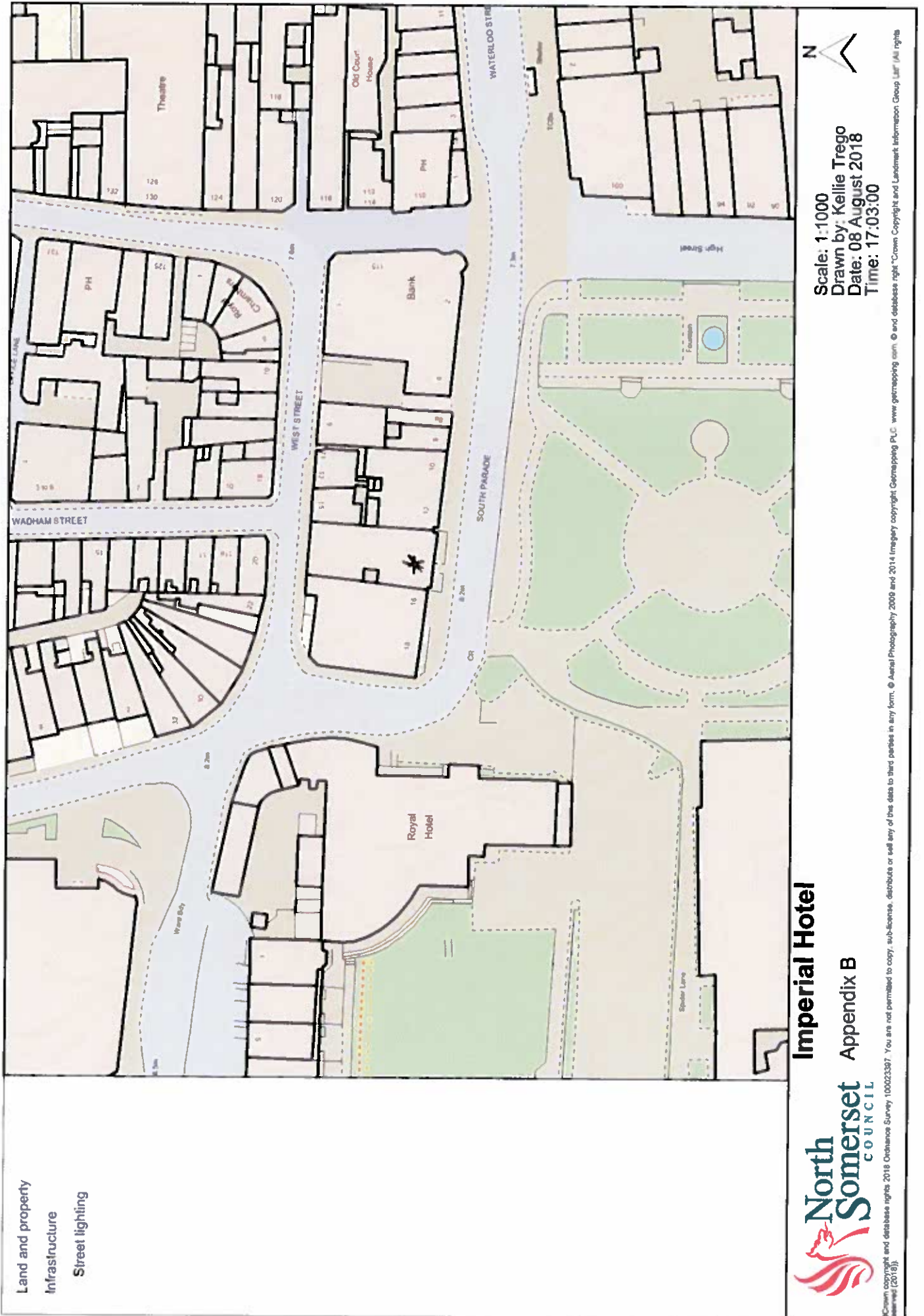



Following yesterday's meeting at the above premises I have provided the list of conditions for the Prevention of Public Nuisance which would be required for the variation.

- Doors and windows within the licensed premises shall be kept closed at 22:00hrs when regulated entertainment is occurring except for access and egress from the premises.
- The playing of live or recorded music in the outside area of the premises shall not be permitted
- The emptying of bottle bins into receptacles outside the premises is only permitted to take place between the hours of 09.00 and 22.00 to minimise disturbance to nearby properties.
- Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all exits requesting customers to leave quietly.

Concerning live music this will stay the same and will finish at 00:00hrs Monday – Sunday as currently specified on the current licence

Proposed Police conditions

- 1 There will be no entry or re-entry to the premises by patrons after 24:00 hours (midnight). The only exception to the rule will be persons leaving the premises for the sole purpose of smoking, who will be supervised by SIA door staff at all times.
- 2 Minimum of ONE SIA door staff on duty on Thursday, Friday, Saturday and nights from 21:00 hours until close and at a ratio of 1 to 100 on the ground floor and at any other days when the premises is open after midnight. Also a minimum of ONE SIA door staff to be employed for any events or functions held on the first floor at a ratio of 1 to 100. On any other days SIA door staff to be employed at the written request of Police or Licensing Authority.

A register shall be maintained solely for the purposes of recording the full name – SIA badge number, time on and off duty of each SIA staff for the event. This register shall be maintained for 12 months and made available for inspection by the Police or Licensing Authority.

- 3 All SIA staff provided in accordance with this licence shall carry a proof of SIA registration and display the correct SIA identification badge and identifiable clothing and within temporary structures.
- 4 CCTV to comply with the North Somerset CCTV Operational Guide Document, version 2-8 March 2012 - and shall be installed to the satisfaction of the Police and Licensing Authority and maintained in good working order. All cameras shall record continuously during trading hours and for one hour afterwards and to include coverage of the entrances and exits. The time and date shall be displayed on the recordings. Recordings shall be maintained for a period of 31 days and handed to the Police or the Licensing Authority for evidential purposes on request. If the CCTV equipment fails the Police and Licensing Authority must be informed as soon as possible and immediate steps shall be taken to put the equipment back into action. A notice shall be displayed at the entrance to the premises advising that a CCTV system is in operation.
- 5 Personal Licence Holder on duty at the venue from 21:00 hours to close.
- 6 Qualified first aider on duty from 21:00 hours until close.
- 7 No under 18's permitted on premise after 22:00 hours.
- 8 To be members of Nitenet and ensure it is monitored by doorstaff (if on duty).

- 9 To be members of the Weston-super-Mare Pubwatch (if one exists) and to abide by the banning list.
- 10 Incident book to be maintained to record all incidents of disorder and ejections. To be kept for a minimum of 12 months and made available for inspection by police or licensing authority on request.
- 11 No drinks to be permitted outside of the premises after 23:00 hrs.
- 12 The 'Challenge 25' scheme must be operated to ensure that any person who appears to be under the age of 25 shall provide documented proof that he/she is over the age of 18 years of age. Proof of age shall only comprise a passport, photo card driving licence, an EU/EEA national ID card of similar document, an HM Forces warrant card or a card bearing the PASS hologram.

Proposed conditions from Carl Smallwood – Environmental health officer

- Doors and windows within the licensed premises shall be kept closed at 22:00hrs when regulated entertainment is occurring except for access and egress from the premises.
- The playing of live or recorded music in the outside area of the premises shall not be permitted
- The emptying of bottle bins into receptacles outside the premises is only permitted to take place between the hours of 09.00 and 22.00 to minimise disturbance to nearby properties.
- Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all exits requesting customers to leave quietly.
